USBC Membership Scholarship Guidelines

Membership Scholarship Overview

The U.S. Breastfeeding Committee (USBC) is committed to outreach to BIPOC-led and serving organizations that have a strong interest in supporting the mission of the USBC but have difficulty affording the full cost of USBC membership.

The USBC describes an organization as **BIPOC-led** when greater than 50% of the organization's leadership team (both board and senior staff, if applicable) publicly identifies as Black, Indigenous, or other people of color.

The USBC describes an organization as **BIPOC serving** when the primary beneficiaries of the organization's services are directed toward BIPOC communities.

Award

Membership scholarships are provided to self-nominated organizations on a case-by-case basis. Scholarship recipients receive complimentary membership to USBC for one full calendar year. The scholarship is renewable for up to five years, permitting funding.

Eligibility

- Scholarships are available to any BIPOC-led and serving organizations that are invested in advancing policy, systems, and environmental changes to make breastfeeding/human milk feeding a viable option for most families.
- Operational Budgets must be less than \$250,000

Scholarship Recipient Requirements

- Applicants that are awarded membership scholarships must :
 - Sign the Membership Scholarship Recipient Declaration.
 - Send an organizational representative to two or more USBC Membership Meetings
 - Contribute to USBC endeavors by:
 - Submitting an abstract to the National Breastfeeding Conference & Convening
 - Representation at the National Breastfeeding Conference & Convening
 - Active participation in the First Food Connection Hub
 - Active participation in capacity-building activities
 - Active participation in advocacy efforts coordinated by the USBC
 - Representation on USBC Committees
 - Representation on the USBC Board of Directors

Application Process

Initial Application Process

- 1. Applicants must complete a membership application and indicate their eligibility for the Membership Scholarship.
- 2. Upon approval, scholarship recipients must submit a Scholarship Recipient Declaration.

Scholarship Extension Process

- 1. Scholarship recipients may request to extend their scholarship for up to five years.
- 2. To extend the award, applicants must have actively contributed to USBC and its endeavors and share how the scholarship has impacted their organization.

Selection Process

- 1. The USBC will award up to 100 organizations. Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis as funding permits.
- 2. Recipients will be notified of the decisions via email.
